 $\underline{\text{Transition/Project Manager Position}} \sim \text{The Trustees}$ are finalising the appointment and contractual arrangements with the preferred candidate for the role. An announcement will be made soon.

<u>Kaumātua Council</u> ~ On Friday 15th September, 3-5pm, at Wairoa Community Centre, Tātau Tātau trustees will be meeting with Kaumātua nominated by their Kāhui/Cluster to the Kaumātua Council. This first meeting is to welcome Kaumātua, introduce them to the trustees and so they can put initial planning steps in place for their inaugural meeting. The 14 Kaumātua will join with Trustees for dinner that evening.

<u>Te Whare Hukahuka Governance Training</u> \sim The 14th & 29th September is set aside for Tātau Tātau trustees to undergo governance training. Te Whare Hukahuka was the preferred trainer chosen from a transparent and contestable process, their notable point of difference being customisation specifically to post settlement governance entities.

Engagement Ohu Lead ~ Trustees are indebted to the solid engagement lead with his Ohu team provided by Apiata Tapine over the past nine months, particularly through our August engagement round. Apiata indicated recently a need to step back with growing demand in his Councillor duties. He will remain in the Engagement Ohu and provide support to our new Engagement Ohu Lead, Huia Huata.
